#### 2012 BRRRRDathon/Photothon

The second running of the World's Coldest Birdathon, the BRRRDathon DID NOT live up to its name with temps in the 30s. But, all had a great time!

An amazing 73 species were found by 21 folks in 8 teams during the January 6-7th event.

Highlights included: Greater and Lesser scaup in Washburn, WI; Spruce Grouse (Lake County Road 2, 2 mi N of Sand River); 2 Sharp-shinned Hawks; 8 species of gulls (including the Glaucous-winged Gull in Duluth); 4 Great Gray Owls (3 in Sax-Zim and 1 in Koochiching County); American Three-toed Woodpecker (Lake County); Varied Thrush (Duluth); Bohemian Waxwing (only 2! ...in Big Falls, MN); 2 Hoary Redpolls and 2 Yellow-rumped Warblers (one on Northland College campus in Ashland, WI, and on at Boy Scout Landing in Duluth)!

Teams birded from Koochiching County, Minnesota on the Canadian border all the way to Washburn, Ashland and

Crex Meadows in Wisconsin. Of course, Duluth, Aitkin County and our beloved Sax-Zim Bog were also heavily birded.

One project we hope to expand is the "BogCam." On a trial basis we placed a Trail Camera in the heart of the Sax-Zim Bog. And we got some surprising results, including this Gray Fox...an uncommon species in NE Minnesota.

#### **Land Purchase**

Though we can't yet announce the location, we have been awarded a \$29,000 grant from the MN DNR's CPL (Conservation Partner's Legacy) Grant program. The sale is in process, with a few hoops to yet jump through, but we hope to give you full details about this 40 acre bog in the next few months. It will be a place for folks to get out of their car and bird from INSIDE a Black Spruce-Tamarack bog. Future plans for the site include a parking area, kiosk and bog boardwalk.





#### Feeding Station on Owl Avenue

Seven feeders were placed on St. Louis County land along Owl Avenue this past winter. The beef suet, black oil sunflower seeds and niger thistle attracted an enthusiastic parade of birds including White-breasted and Red-breasted Nuthatches, Black-capped Chickadees, Downy, Hairy and Pileated Woodpeckers, Blue Jays, a flock of Common Redpolls and Pine Siskins that also included one Hoary Redpoll. Gray Jays were also seen nearby. The feeding station will be expanded this coming winter and more photogenic perches will be placed for photographers.

### Does the Bog really need protecting?

As you can see from these Google Earth images taken only one year apart, the Sax-Zim Bog peatlands are under tremendous logging pressure. The time is now to protect bog tracts for future birders and photographers.

#### Sax-Zim Bog Birder/Photographer Welcome Center

The building is being designed by AIA architect Doug Zaun of Wagner-Zaun in Duluth. Construction will depend on how quickly we can raise the dollars needed. The 18'x32' off-the-grid building will have a green roof and electricity will come from solar panels. The Welcome Center will be the "Gateway" to the Bog and will be a place for folks to meet other birders, share sightings, have a cup of coffee, buy souvenirs, warm up, use an outhouse, and enjoy/watch/photograph the birds at the many feeders.
